



ACUPUNCTURE TREATMENT



Acupuncture is a technique in which practitioners insert fine needles into the skin to treat health problems. The needles may be manipulated manually or stimulated with small electrical currents (electroacupuncture). Acupuncture has been in use in some form for at least 2,500 years.

Our Experience with Acupunture with Champ

Tn 1972, Richard Nixon visited main-Lland China. At that point in history very little was known about the contemporary culture and conditions on the mainland. With President Nixon's visit there was a relative thaw in U.S. Chinese relations and a large cultural exchange took place. Those of us who were alive were all very interested in the everyday lives of the Chinese people. One area of interest was how the Chinese practice medicine. During that period, I watched documentary evidence of a lady receiving open chest surgery with acupuncture for pain control. She was awake and responding to the surgeons throughout the procedure. To say that I was amazed and impressed was an understatement.

Later during the 1990's I injured an ankle and was just prior to my days off but unable to take time off work. I had to be able to walk and spend 12-14 hours on my feet. I knew a nurse practitioner



who was getting certified to do acupuncture, so I asked her if she could help. She treated me and the result was that I was able to recover, and my pain was controlled enough that I could work by the time my weekend was over.

In 2021 our boy Champ, (Silver Grand Champion "Shana's Silver Streak") jumped on our bed in the middle of the night missed his footing and fell off. At first, he was sore for a little bit but seemed ok. But then started showing signs of increasing soreness. Everyone thought because of his age he was developing arthritis and so he was placed on Vetprofen to help with the pain and inflammation. At first this seemed to work. But the spring of 2022 found him with increasing pain and beginning to show neuro-

logical problems in his back legs in addition to the pain. We decided to take him to Texas A&M for a full work up of his back. It was then we discovered that he had reacted badly to his Vetprofen, and it had damaged his kidneys. But they felt that he would benefit from a laminectomy. When I brought him home, he showed an almost immediate improvement to the neurological motor symptoms but was still having pain despite the special nerve pain medicine he came home with. So, we searched for and found a veterinarian that could help his pain and post-surgical inflammation by adding acupuncture to his treatment regimen. This along with laser therapy which stimulates some of the same neurologic points had the desired effect and gave our boy good relief from most of his pain.

Sadly, despite everything we did medically and at home, we were unable to get ahead of his kidney failure. In his last week despite his increasing suffering as the poisons built up in his body, he would ask for me to take him outside so we could be together, and he could look out and enjoy the sights and smells of the yard. On April 28th with the help of our veterinarian, he crossed the rainbow bridge in Lana and my arms.

I'm convinced that had the kidney failure not been a factor, the acupuncture that Champ received would have seen him back to himself much quicker than if it hadn't been available. As it was the acupuncture helped his last days be much more comfortable perhaps allowed us just a little more time with him than otherwise.

Class Preparation Puppy Class and Basic Obedience

by Jeff Young

My approach to the classes I lead focuses on knowing the customer, providing value beyond the classroom, keeping it interesting, and communicating throughout.

Prior to the first "with dogs" session I review each student's signup sheet and focus on the dog and handler feedback, recognizing that the true test is working with the dog in class.

- I research if unfamiliar with breed and try to determine what is likely to motivate this type of dog.
- Age of the dog is important; still a puppy? Many dogs still exhibit puppy behaviors even if fully grown. High energy levels and limited focus might make the handler believe their dog has behavior issues when in reality, the dog is just acting his age.
- Look for any "issues" identified in the questionnaire. I'm primarily looking for any indication of dog or human aggression. We've all dealt with this but it's helpful to have a heads up for safety reasons and overall class management.

Subsequent to orientation, the first weekly email goes out consisting of the following:

- Safety considerations; proper way to enter the facility, dog introduction etiquette, control your dog at all times, etc.
- Step-by-step explanation of the training method. This is a theme I reinforce constantly in class and with subsequent weekly emails. My intent is to develop a training pattern that's easy to follow and provide

consistency for both dog and handler. These are the basics and I want them to do the basics brilliantly as a foundation to continued successful and fun training.

- Putting the dog in "training mode"; i.e. "ready to work?"
- Luring with food for position and engagement
- The importance of marking behavior in a way that is timely and clear to the dog; i.e. "yes", "good", "click", etc.
- Treat handling and delivery
- How to hold the treat; make the dog work for it
- Variability of the rewards; jackpotting, etc.
- Making rewards an "event"; the dog should have no question he did what was asked and it should be fun and engaging for the dog. Engaged dogs are trainable dogs.
- Exiting "training mode"; i.e. "we're done"
- I include the for first week with dogs; i.e. what I plan to cover that class session and a link to Michael Ellis' "Philosophy of Dog Training" video, and another link to a video of Ellis playing tug with his Malinois "Pi" to provide an example of high level dog/handler engagement. The "Philosophy of Dog Training" video is a great introduction into classical and operant conditioning and does a nice job explaining why markers are so important in training.

Throughout the course I send a weekly email recapping what we learned in class and the agenda for next session, along with:

- Purina "healthy dog" chart; most students are shocked to see what a healthy dog looks like and it gets them thinking about feeding their dogs based on activity level and daily caloric needs.
- Obedience hand and arm signals information
- Basic canine first aid information
- Encouragement to join DTCDC and continue training
- Prong collar fit and use introduction video
- Promoting the club and identifying candidates for Intermediate and/or potential club membership

Individual, targeted emails based on need, skill level of trainer, etc.; often point them to Leerburg.com and their videos:

- "Power of Training Your Dog With Food"
- "Power of Playing Tug With Your Dog"
- "Leash Skills"
- "Training the Recall"

Midway through the course we provide an obedience demonstration of about fifteen minutes

- Generates interest in the club
- Great opportunity to reinforce what's really necessary to properly train a dog

Classroom management

- If sufficient number of assistant instructors we usually break up into rotating "stations"
- I try to "float" in order to work one-on-one with students
- Ensure good mechanics
- Assist with continuing issues or challenges

Graduation

Graduation is recognition for a job well done and an opportunity for the students to show off what they've learned to family and friends.

- We try to make it fun with contests; i.e. "best trick", "fast dog" (blind recall)
- Recognize Participants
- Most improved
- "This dog needs a job" high drive dogs with potential and willing handler
- I take a lot of photos and post them to a photo sharing site and then send a link to the students.

In summary, my goal as an instructor is to exceed our customer's expectations by; showing the handlers a method of training that is fair to the dog and easily understood and repeatable, encourage continued involvement in the club, and providing an atmosphere that is fun and rewarding for both dogs and handlers. **Dog Training Club**

Legislative Liaison Update National, State and Local

UKC acquired Field Dog Stud Book (FDSB) and American Field Dog Publishing Company back in 2021. Both of these registries had served the dog world for over 120 years. UKC has been working on blending these 2 historic registries together (which was not an easy task!) and now, *as of Jan. 1, 2024*, the first installment of one stud book with Dual Privileges (offered both retroactively and moving forward) has begun.

As a result of this blending, *UKC has implemented some changes that will be new to all customers* whether they have UKC or American Field backgrounds. Some of the changes include event entering eligibility, a change in registration numbers, pedigree



Nudge Your Nose



This is another dog trick that is just cute to watch. Your dog nudges you with his nose without licking you. Approach your dog with your face. Hold a treat up to your nose. Your dog will want it. Give him the treat when he touches your nose with his nose.

After a while, use only your empty hand to lure your dog to your nose. When he touches it, give him word signals such as "nudge" or "nose. Praise him each time he touches your nose. Now reduce the hand signals and give your dog his treat when he touches your nose in response to the word signal.



TERRI CLARY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In keeping with the club's mission and in recognition of the hard work of both dog and handler, the Terri Clary Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the canine/handler pair that has made the most progress overcoming significant training challenges. This Scholarship allows dog and handler to come back to the next session of beginner obedience classes, free of charge, to allow them both to meet their goals.

JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIP

A club member has anonymously given \$1000 to start a Junior Scholarship and have this open to other members donating to keep it going. Eligible young people age 16 or younger with a GPA (Grade Point Average) of 3.0 are eligible. The student may receive it twice and will be eligible to receive help for their first year of membership in the club.
