

ARTICLE VI - THE CLUB YEAR, ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. Club Year

The Club's fiscal year shall begin on the first day of January and end on the thirty-first day of December.

Section 2. Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of November at which time officers and members at large for the ensuing year shall be elected by secret written ballot from among those nominated in accordance with Section 4 of this Article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election, and each retiring officer shall turn over to his or her successor in office all properties and records related to that office within ten (10) days after the election.

Section 3. Elections

Elections shall be by secret ballot, except when there is only one nominee for an office, and then it may be a voice vote.

Section 4. Nominations

No person may be a candidate in a Club election who has not been nominated in advance by one of the following procedures:

- A. At the August regular meeting of the Club, a Nominating Committee shall be elected by ballot. Each Active Member in good standing and in attendance will be allowed to submit five (5) names on the elective written ballot. The five (5) members receiving the highest number of votes shall serve as the Nominating Committee, with the person receiving the greatest number of votes as chair. Any tie shall be decided by a run-off ballot. A Corporate Director will be on the Committee as a non-voting advisor.
- B. The Nominating Committee shall meet within ten (10) days from its election and shall nominate one (1) candidate for each office to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting in November, and shall secure the consent of each nominee. These candidates shall be published in the September Pawprint and announced at the September regular meeting of the Club.
- C. Additional nominations may be made at the October regular meeting of the Club by any members in attendance provided that the person so nominated has signified in advance and in writing his or her willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one (1) position. Additional nominations, which are provided for herein, may be made only from among those members who have not accepted a nomination from the Nominating Committee.
- Nominations cannot be made at the Annual Meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this section.

Canine Freestyle

Canine Freestyle, also known as Dog Dance, is a fun sport between dogs and their handlers, encompassing two main variations.

The first is Heelwork to Music, which is a routine to music consisting of close-in heeling and tricks. There are eight main heeling positions, but the handler is also free to create their own unique positions and moves. The standard positions are, Left and right-side heel facing the same and opposite direction of the handler, and in front and behind the handler facing left, or right.

The second is Musical Freestyle (referred to as Freestyle Heelwork to Music in Europe). Freestyle differs from heelwork, in

that instead of focusing on the usage of the various positions, there is more of a focus on distance work, between the legs moves, jumping, and any other creative or fun move the handler decides to use or create.



In both, one of the main focuses is on the bond between the dog and handler, and one of the most important aspects of the routine is if the dog and handler are having an enjoyable time. Unlike in Obedience or Rally, there are no required sequences or moves. The handler is free to build their routine to their, and their dog's strengths and tastes in music. Costuming and use of props are highly encouraged, and many competitions have best prop and costume contests.

Their Heelwork program was performed to "Man! I Feel Like a Woman" by Shania Twain. They are Junior National Champions in both variations.



History of Canine Freestyle

The idea for canine freestyle started in the 1980s, with the first official dog dance group governing body founded in the early 1990s. It was first popularized in Canada and Great Britian, with the first display of Heelwork to Music performed by Mary Ray at Crufts in 1993. Soon after, Heelwork became an official competition at Crufts, with Freestyle Heelwork to Music being added later. In 1999 the World Canine Freestyle Organization was created from a combination of older now extinct organizations, and groups. It is the most active canine freestyle titling organization in the United States.

How to get started dancing with your dog

One of the best ways to get started is to build a solid foundation of basic obedience. High-level obedience skills, while helpful, are not necessary, though many Rally and Obedience moves can be turned into fun freestyle and heelwork moves.

In addition to obedience, teaching your dog a variety of fun tricks is a great start. Some popular tricks include spins, circling objects, circling the handler, jumping, variations on shaking hands and waving, and interacting with props such as buttons and opening things.

To get started competing through the World Canine Freestyle Organization, there are both online and in-person competitions. Online competitions are a fun and inexpensive way to get started. These competitions are judged via video that you send to the club hosting the competition, and then the judge scores the routine and then sends out placements and scores. There are five levels of titles in both Heelwork and Freestyle. The

beginner-level routines are allowed to be either on or off leash, and the beginning length of the routine is between 1:30-2:15 minutes.







Legislative Liaison Update

National, State and Local

At the DTCDC new member meeting on Sept. 25, there was some discussion about dogs and restaurant patios that allow dogs and exactly what is Texas law on this issue? This article is due to that discussion so that we may all know what the Texas law is on dogs in outdoor restaurant areas.

In Texas in the past, restaurants that wanted to be dog-friendly were often required by the city where they were located, to apply for a permit, and/or have extra restaurant inspections and often the restaurant had to pay as much as \$265 for a renewal permit. Other cities didn't seem to care and put no restrictions or permit requirements on restaurants in their boundaries.

Due to the discrepancies between different cities requirements about this issue, the Texas Legislature decided to create Senate Bill 476 in Jan. of 2019 to essentially change the state's health code so that there would be a uniform way to handle the increasing popularity of dogs going with their owners to restaurants while still maintaining the health and safety of the diners at restaurants. The bill was passed almost unanimously in both houses of the Texas Legislature and Gov. Greg Abbott signed it into law on June 4, 2019.

As a result of this law: Cities are now prohibited from putting restrictions on restaurants that want to allow their customers to bring their dogs to the restaurant's outdoor dining area such as a patio or sidewalk seating area. No permits or fees can be charged to restaurants by cities for allowing dogs in their outdoor areas. The cities may not put conditions on the restaurant in any form other than enforcing the rules set down by the Texas Legislature over this law.

The rules are:

- The restaurant must post a sign in a conspicuous location in the outdoor dining area stating that
 dogs are allowed in that area. This is so that people who might object to being seated in an area
 with a dog are alerted to the fact that a dog could be in that area so they can choose to sit elsewhere.
- A dog and its owner must access the outdoor dining area from an outdoor location such as a walkway or gate or sidewalk adjacent to the dining area.
- Customers with a dog are not allowed to enter the restaurant to gain access to the outdoor dining area.
- The dog must be kept on a leash and controlled at all times.
- The dog is not to be allowed on a seat, table or countertop in that area.
- The restaurant is not allowed to prepare any food in that outside dining area due to the fact that they have chosen to allow dogs in that area.

Note: The rules that govern service dogs are slightly different and set by the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) which basically states that service animals can go anywhere the public can go including an indoor dining room but they are not allowed on chairs or tables in the restaurant.



Head Down on the Floor



Start with your dog in the down position.

Wait for any tiny head movement toward the floor. Immediately say "Yes!" to mark the movement, then deliver a treat on the floor.

Repeat until your dog has caught on and is deliberately lowering their head. Over time, wait for movements that are gradually closer to the floor until your dog is consistently touching their chin on the floor.

Next, add a split second of duration before saying "Yes!" and giving the treat. Add more and more duration until they're resting their chin on the floor. The secret is to always offer the treat close to the floor.




Jan Bruner brags:

The <u>Highest Average Obedience Score Award and Highest Average Rally Score Award</u> are awarded to the club member achieving the highest average score on the three legs required to earn an Obedience Title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the highest average score on the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson</u>, who determines which club members had the highest average Obedience and Rally scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

The Most Improved Obedience Score Award and Most Improved Rally Score Award are awarded to the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn an Obedience title (i.e., CD, CDX, UD equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC) and the club member achieving the greatest point score improvement between any two of the three legs required to earn a Rally Title (i.e., RN, RA, RE equivalent from AKC, ASCA, UKC). To qualify: By November 15th Club members submit the form on the next page indicating the dates, names of the shows, and the scores for each leg to the Purchasing Committee Chairperson, who determines which club members had the most improvement between scores. The third leg of the eligible scores must be earned during the period of November 15 of the previous year to November 14 of the current year. There is no limit on the number of times a club member may earn and receive these awards. The awards are presented annually by DTCDC.

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR SCORES: Scores must be submitted via U.S. Mail or email to Lynda Holman **BY NOVEMBER 15, 2024**. Fill in the information on the Award Submission Form on the next page and send to Lynda. **Use a separate form for each award for which you are submitting scores**. Scores submitted are to be for each of the three legs required to earn the degree. 4th legs do not count. The first 2 legs of the degree can be received at any prior time, but the 3rd leg that earned the degree must be received during the period November 15, 2023 to November 14, 2024. Highest Average is an average of the legs that earned the title. Most Improved must be points between 1st and 2nd, 2nd and 3rd, or 1st and 3rd legs. It cannot go backwards.
